<p><b>Economic Sciences</b> Revise requirements for minor in Sustainable Development</p>	<p><b>Sustainable Development</b></p> <p>The program offers a minor in sustainable development. The minor is comprised of ECONS 326, one course from each of the following four aspect areas: policy, history, and theory (HISTORY 409, 494, PHIL 370, POL S 430, PSYCH 466, SOE 335 [M], or 438); environmental (ARCH 490, 494, BIOLOGY 330, 372 [M], CE 401, CROP SCI 360, SOE 110, 285, 300, 303, or <del>444</del> 483); social/cultural (ANTH 203, 309, ANTH/SOC 418, SOC 331, 332, 415, 430, SOE 312, WOMEN ST 332, or WOMEN ST 460); economic (ECONS 330, 427, 428, 430, 431, I BUS 380, or I BUS 496); and one additional course from any of the aspect areas. The minor requires 18 credit hours, with at least 9 hours-credits at the 300-400 level taken in residence at WSU or through WSU-approved education abroad or educational exchange courses. - <sup>3</sup> 200-level HISTORY course: Choose one from HISTORY 230, 231, 232, 270, 271, 272, 273, 274, or 275.
- <sup>4</sup> Two years of high school foreign language or at least two semesters of college-level foreign language are required by the College of Arts and Sciences for graduation.
