Summary of Catalog Updates for:

English; Fine Arts; Mathematics and Statistics; Music; Politics, Philosophy, and Public Affairs; Psychology; Sociology; and Women's, Gender, and Sexuality Studies

The following schedules of studies reflect the updates to the *WSU Catalog* 4-year plans in response to the new Equity and Justice [EQJS] UCORE designation. The updates have been reviewed and approved by the respective departments and college leadership. The effective date is fall 2023 for incoming students.

The College of Arts and Sciences will require all 7 Ways of Knowing designations for CAS students (ARTS, BSCI, DIVR, EQJS, HUM, PSCI, and SSCI), but will drop the current "additional 3 credits of ARTS/HUM/SSCI" to make this credit-neutral.

The other UCORE designations have not changed, and CAS will continue to require the additional lab credit.

ADVISORY NOTE: The updates below do not reflect any requirement changes that are in process for next year's catalog. Any requirement changes will be updated with the EQJS information once approved.
